Food Bank of Central & Eastern NC Announces Total Donations from Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day

RALEIGH, NC - On Thursday, October 24, fairgoers from across the state donated to Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day. During Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day, six cans of Food Lion brand food were donated in exchange for free admission to the North Carolina State Fair. Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day at the North Carolina State Fair benefits the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina and sister food banks around the state.

The total for 2019 Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day is a record 318,428 pounds which equals more than 265,000 meals for those facing hunger in North Carolina. Last year, fairgoers donated approximately 250,000 pounds to North Carolinians in need.

"We're so thankful for this outpouring of support from North Carolinians, our incredible partner Food Lion, and from the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and the N.C. State Fair," said Peter Werbicki, President & CEO of the Food Bank. "This record amount of food will serve people facing hunger across the state for months to come."

Thanks to the generosity of North Carolinians, Hunger Relief Day at the fair has now raised more than 5.3 million pounds since it began in 1993. 2019 was the 16th year of Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day and is one of the largest one-day canned-food drives in the state. Photos for use attached.

In fiscal year 2017-2018, the Food Bank distributed nearly 70 million pounds of food (over half of which was perishable) and non-food essentials through these agencies. Sadly, hunger remains a serious problem in central and eastern North Carolina.
